Sustainability & Responsible Sourcing Data 2023

CPI Mortars Ltd is the leading dry mortar supplier in the UK and is committed to sustainable and responsible sourcing. Our production facilities throughout the UK are certified to ISO9001, 14001 and BES6001

We actively promote responsible sourcing throughout our supply chain and have established measures within our company to ensure that we are continually improving our environmental performance. The following information has been independently verified.

CO₂ EMISSIONS

In 2023, our emissions per tonne of product sold were 20.32Kg. Our emissions per million £ turnover were 166Tonnes.

CPI is part of the Grafton Group. In 2024 Grafton Group received validation by the Science Based Targets Initiative for its commitment to reach net zero greenhouse gas emissions across the value chain by 2050 at the latest and the associated near (by end 2030) and long-term targets (by end 2050), the detail of which can be found on our website. <https://www.graftonplc.com/esg>.

WATER

Our mains water usage during 2022 was 5.8 Litres per Tonne sold. The usage in 2023 decreased by 12% to 5.1 Litres per Tonne sold.

For 2024, we are targeting a reduction in our mains water usage of 5%, compared to 2023.

RESOURCE USE

In 2023, we used less than 1% by-products/recycled materials such as cement replacements within our products.

For 2024, we are targeting to increase this to above 1% of the total tonnage sold.

The quantity of recollected mortar during 2023 remained below 1% of the total tonnage sold. This was achieved by a combination of improved communication with our customer base and a focus on improving factory production efficiencies.

For 2024, we are targeting to remain below 1% of the total tonnage sold.

RECYCLING

During 2023, our general waste production was 0.18% of the total tonnage sold. 97.8% of our general waste was recycled.

For 2024, we are targeting to reduce our general waste production by 5% and increase our recycling of general waste by 2%, compared to 2023.

TRAINING

On average we conducted 11 credits of training per person during 2023.

For 2024, we are committed to delivering a further 10 credits of training per person.

LOCAL COMMUNITY COMPLAINT INCIDENTS

During 2023, complaints from local residents were at a low level. These complaints were investigated, and the corrective and preventive actions reported to the local authority. All of the production sites are classified as low risk by the local authorities.

TRANSPORT

During 2023, our constituent transport carbon impact was 6.17Kg of the total tonnage sold.

For 2024, we are targeting to not increase our constituent transport carbon impact compared to 2023.

During 2023, our product transport carbon impact was 5.11Kg of the total tonnage sold.

For 2024, we are targeting to reduce our product transport carbon impact by 2.5%, compared to 2023.

To reduce our environmental and social impacts, we have a strategy to increase the amount of HVO our vehicles use throughout the UK and we continue to source our constituent materials from local businesses where practicable.
